As of 2000, Moretown had a population of 1,653, comprised mainly of rural residents. The population has increased by 16.8% since 1990. Moretown contains more males than females. Approximately 50% of the total population is male, while 50% is female. Table A. shows the breakdown of age groups amongst the total population in Moretown. Approximately 28% of the population is children, age 18 and under, while 9% of the population is senior citizens, age 65 and over. The number of residents age 18 and under and age 65 and over has increased throughout the last decade. There are currently 17.6% more children and 13.5% more senior citizens in Moretown than there were in 1990.

Of the total population in Moretown, 100% live in households. Of these people, 82% live in family households, while 18% live in nonfamily households. Of the 656 total households in Moretown, 68% are family households, while 32% are nonfamily households. Most of the family households contain 2 to 4 persons. Approximately 39% are 2-person households, while 24% are 3-person households, and 27% are 4-person households. Most of the nonfamily households contain 1 or 2 persons. Approximately 67% are 1-person households and 28% are 2-person households. Compared to 1990, there are currently 21.5% more households in Moretown. See Table B. for details related to household data.

Of the 445 total families that reside in Moretown, approximately 83% are married-couple families. Of these married-couple families, 53% have children under the age of 18, while 47% do not have children under the age of 18. The remaining 17% of families in Moretown fall under the category of other family. See Table C. for details. Approximately 64% of these families have a female householder with no husband present, while 36% have a male householder with no wife present. In total, there are 15.6% more families residing in Moretown than there were in 1990.

In Moretown, there are 925 workers age 16 and over, which is a 17.4 % increase from 1990. Approximately 17% of these workers work in Moretown, while 83% work outside

of the community. The majority of workers, 88%, travel to work by car, truck, van, or motorcycle. Approximately 85% of those who travel to work by car, truck, van, or motorcycle drive alone, while 15% use carpools. See Table D. for other means of transportation used by workers in Moretown. Although there are a range of travel times for Moretown workers, 31% commute between 5 and 19 minutes. Approximately 37% commute between 20 and 39 minutes. Only 4% travel less than 5 minutes to work, while 1% travel more than 90 minutes to work from Moretown.

In Moretown, there were 424 people attending school at some level in 2000, which is a 25% increase from 1990. A range of educational attainment is represented by the population in Moretown. Only 0.2% of all residents 25 years and older have not completed any level of schooling, while 30.5% have only a high school diploma. Approximately 44% of Moretown residents 25 years and older hold some type of degree, ranging from an Associates degree to a Doctorate degree. See Table E. for details.

In Moretown, there are 958 residents in the labor force, which is 75% of the population age 16 and over. This is a 14.7% increase from 1990. Approximately 97% of the people in the civilian labor force are employed, while 3% are unemployed. The 33 residents that are unemployed represent 17.5% less than the unemployment level in 1990. All of the industries covered in the Census are represented by residents of Moretown. The industries with the largest percentage of workers are: education, health, and social services, which represents 22.7% of employed residents; public administration, which represents 11.7% of employed residents; and retail trade, which represents 12% of employed residents. Table G. shows household income and family income data for Moretown. All income classes are represented here. Approximately 6% of the total households have an income of less than \$10,000; 17% have an income between \$10,000 and \$25,000; 30% have an income between \$25,000 and \$50,000; 28% have an income between \$50,000 and \$75,000; 12% have an income between \$75,000 and \$100,000; and 7% have an income above \$100,000. In 1999, the median household income in Moretown was \$47,750, which is a 53.5% increase from 1990. Approximately 2% of the total families have an income of less than \$10,000; 11% have an income between \$10,000 and \$25,000; 33% have an income between \$25,000 and \$50,000; 33% have an income between \$50,000 and \$75,000; 12% have an income between \$75,000 and \$100,000; and 9% have an income above \$100,000. In 1999, the median family income in Moretown was \$52,202, which is a 49.3% increase from 1990. In 1999, the per capita income for Moretown was \$20,283, a 45.6% increase from 1990. Approximately 7% of people in Moretown for whom poverty status is determined have incomes below poverty level. Fortunately, the 109 residents who have incomes below poverty level are 7.6% less than those who suffered from poverty in 1990.

There are 727 total housing units in Moretown, most of which are located in a rural area. This is a 13.8% increase from the total housing units in 1990. Approximately 89% of these housing units are currently occupied, leaving only 11% vacant. Of these vacant housing units, none are for rent, while 6% are for sale. Approximately 80% of the vacant housing units are for seasonal, recreational, or occasional use. There are currently 22.2%

less housing vacancies in Moretown than there were in 1990 and the occupancy level has increased by 20.4% over the last decade. See Table H. for details.

Of the 650 total occupied housing units in Moretown, 60% are 1 to 2 person households, while 35% are 3 to 4 person households. Of the 727 total housing units in the Town, most have between 4 and 6 rooms. Approximately 7% have 1 to 2 rooms; 22% have 3 to 4 rooms; 38% have 5 to 6 rooms; 22% have 7 to 8 rooms; and 11% have 9 or more rooms. Many of the housing units in Moretown were built prior to 1980. Approximately 22% of the houses were built before 1939; 39% were built between 1940 and 1979; and 39% were built after 1980. Approximately 95% of the total housing units in Moretown contain complete plumbing facilities, leaving 5% without adequate plumbing. See Table J. for details.
