As of 2000, Orange had a population of 965, comprised completely of rural residents. The population has increased by 5.5% since 1990. Orange contains more females than males. Approximately 51% of the total population is female, while 49% is male. Table A. shows the breakdown of age groups amongst the total population in Orange. Approximately 28% of the population is children, age 18 and under, while 10% of the population is senior citizens, age 65 and over. The number of residents age 18 and under has decreased and the number of residents age 65 and over has increased throughout the last decade. There are currently 11.6% less children and 22% more senior citizens in Orange than there were in 1990.

Of the total population in Orange, 100% live in households. Of these people, 89% live in family households, while 11% live in nonfamily households. Of the 372 total households in Orange, 77% are family households, while 23% are nonfamily households. Most of the family households contain 2 to 4 persons. Approximately 41% are 2-person households, while 26% are 3-person households, and 22% are 4-person households. All of the nonfamily households contain 1 or 2 persons. Approximately 74% are 1-person households and 26% are 2-person households. Compared to 1990, there are currently 19.2% more households in Orange. See Table B. for details related to household data.

Of the 285 total families that reside in Orange, approximately 91% are married-couple families. Of these married-couple families, 46% have children under the age of 18, while 54% do not have children under the age of 18. The remaining 9% of families in Orange fall under the category of other family. See Table C. for details. Approximately 65% of these families have a female householder with no husband present, while 35% have a male householder with no wife present. In total, there are 11.3% more families residing in Orange than there were in 1990.

In Orange, there are 489 workers age 16 and over, which is a 7 % increase from 1990. Approximately 13% of these workers work in Orange, while 87% work outside of the

community. The majority of workers, 96%, travel to work by car, truck, van, or motorcycle. Approximately 82% of those who travel to work by car, truck, van, or motorcycle drive alone, while 18% use carpools. See Table D. for other means of transportation used by workers in Orange. Although there are a range of travel times for Orange workers, 30% commute between 5 and 19 minutes. Approximately 49% commute between 20 and 39 minutes. Only 1% travel less than 5 minutes to work, while 1% travel more than 90 minutes to work from Orange.

In Orange, there were 229 people attending school at some level in 2000, which is a 3.4% decrease from 1990. A range of educational attainment is represented by the population in Orange. Only 0.3% of all residents 25 years and older have not completed any level of schooling, while 46% have only a high school diploma. Approximately 18% of Orange residents 25 years and older hold some type of degree, ranging from an Associates degree to a Professional degree. See Table E. for details.

In Orange, there are 528 residents in the labor force, which is 71% of the population age 16 and over. This is a 15.5% increase from 1990. Approximately 95% of the people in the civilian labor force are employed, while 5% are unemployed. The 29 residents that are unemployed represent 3.3% less than the unemployment level in 1990. All of the industries covered in the Census are represented by residents of Orange. The industries with the largest percentage of workers are: education, health, and social services, which represents 19% of employed residents; construction, which represents 12.8% of employed residents; retail trade, which represents 12.6% of employed residents; and manufacturing, which represents 11.8% of employed residents. Table G. shows household income and family income data for Orange. All income classes are represented here. Approximately 8% of the total households have an income of less than \$10,000; 20% have an income between \$10,000 and \$25,000; 36% have an income between \$25,000 and \$50,000; 26% have an income between \$50,000 and \$75,000; 5% have an income between \$75,000 and \$100,000; and 5% have an income above \$100,000. In 1999, the median household income in Orange was \$40,300, which is a 60% increase from 1990. Approximately 5% of the total families have an income of less than \$10,000; 16% have an income between \$10,000 and \$25,000; 39% have an income between \$25,000 and \$50,000; 29% have an income between \$50,000 and \$75,000; 7% have an income between \$75,000 and \$100,000; and 5% have an income above \$100,000. In 1999, the median family income in Orange was \$44,375, which is a 64.1% increase from 1990. In 1999, the per capita income for Orange was \$16,356, a 59.4% increase from 1990. Approximately 7% of people in Orange for whom poverty status is determined have incomes below poverty level. Fortunately, the 68 residents who have incomes below poverty level are 32.7% less than those who suffered from poverty in 1990.

There are 422 total housing units in Orange, all of which are located in a rural area. This is a 17.5% increase from the total housing units in 1990. Approximately 86% of these housing units are currently occupied, leaving 14% vacant. Of these vacant housing units, 5% are for rent, while 7% are for sale. Approximately 80% of the vacant housing units are for seasonal, recreational, or occasional use. There are currently 27.7% more housing

vacancies in Orange than there were in 1990 and the occupancy level has increased by 16% over the last decade. See Table H. for details.

Of the 362 total occupied housing units in Orange, 55% are 1 to 2 person households, while 35% are 3 to 4 person households. Of the 422 total housing units in the Town, most have between 4 and 8 rooms. Approximately 5% have 1 to 2 rooms; 19% have 3 to 4 rooms; 44% have 5 to 6 rooms; 23% have 7 to 8 rooms; and 9% have 9 or more rooms. Many of the housing units in Orange were built prior to 1980. Approximately 20% of the houses were built before 1939; 36% were built between 1940 and 1979; and 44% were built after 1980. Approximately 93% of the total housing units in Orange contain complete plumbing facilities, leaving 7% without adequate plumbing. See Table J. for details.
